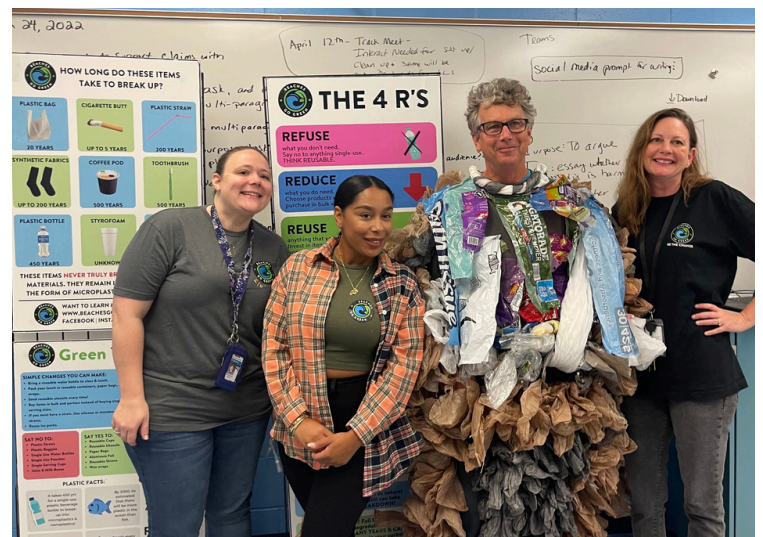

BGG CONTINUES TO RECYCLE BUTTS WITH TERRACYCLE

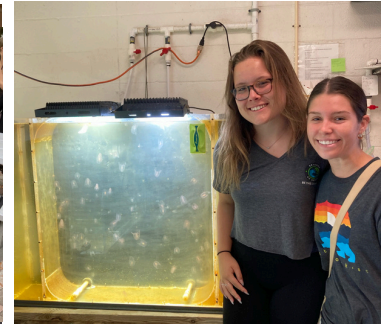


Beaches Go Green continues to collect, mail in and recycle littered cigarette butts with Terracycle. Many of the butts collected are from Keep American Beautiful (KAB) cigarette butt collections canisters that we have installed in the last couple of years via KAB grants. To date, BGG has collected more than 88,000 cigarette butts from Amelia Island through Fernandina Beach, FL.

Cigarette butts are the MOST littered item on the planet. The filters contain a plastic called cellulose acetate. They can take up to 5 years to break up into microplastics. All the while, these butts leach toxic chemicals into the water & soil like arsenic, formaldehyde, lead, nicotine & more!

BGG STUDENT CLUBS @ UF WHITNEY LABS & SEA TURTLE HOSPITAL

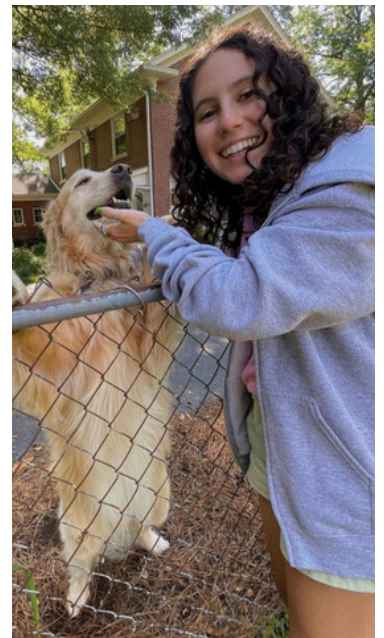

REUSABLE BOTTLES FOR SPORTS- YMCA CAMP IMMOKALEE

We kicked off the summer with our BGG Reusable Bottles for Sports program at YMCA's Camp Immokalee in Keystone Heights, FL.

1800 summer campers & counselors received SIC brand stainless steel REUSABLE water bottles with two goals:

- 1) to reduce plastic pollution in our environment
- 2) to decrease our youth's exposure to the toxic chemicals that leach from plastic into our food and drink especially when heated and as plastic ages.

YMCA Camp Immokalee's Executive Director, Richard Bombach had this to say about our RBS program:

"When I arrived at Camp Immokalee just before summer, I was absolutely blown away with the water bottles that were to be provided to our campers. I have been at camps over the past twenty years where plastic and foam waste have been some of the biggest battles that I've faced in running my programs. This has been the first facility where the "Leave No Trace" program actually has an ACTION to REDUCE WASTE and make the active effort to reduce our footprint on the land, our lake, as well as the beaches and oceans as these kids take their water bottles home from camp. I would love to ensure that YMCA Camp Immokalee continues working with Beaches Go Green for the foreseeable future. Again, thank you for all you're doing for our small community and for generations to come."

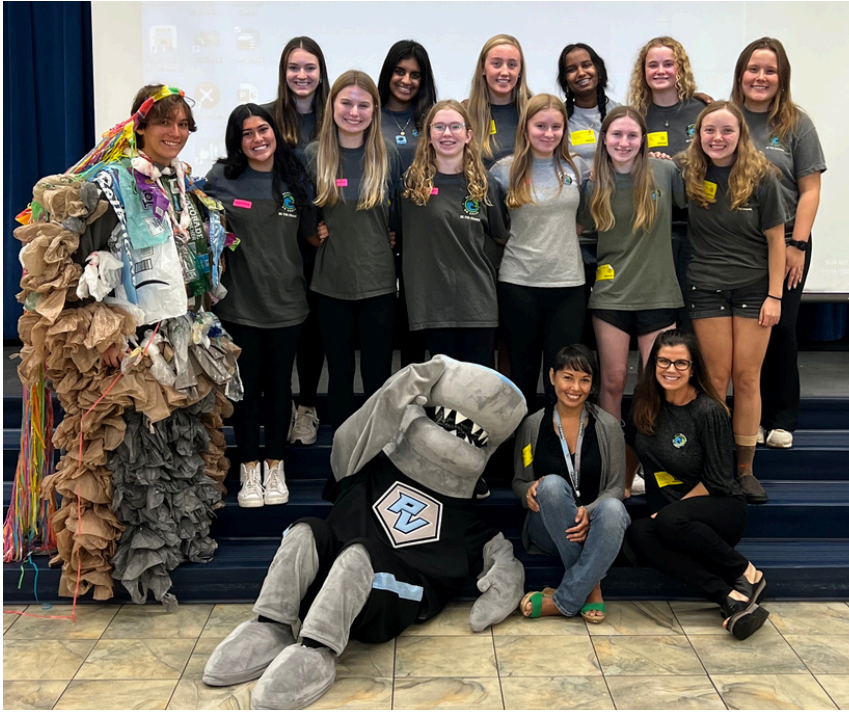
BEACHES GO GREEN RECEIVES COMMUNITY AWARDS

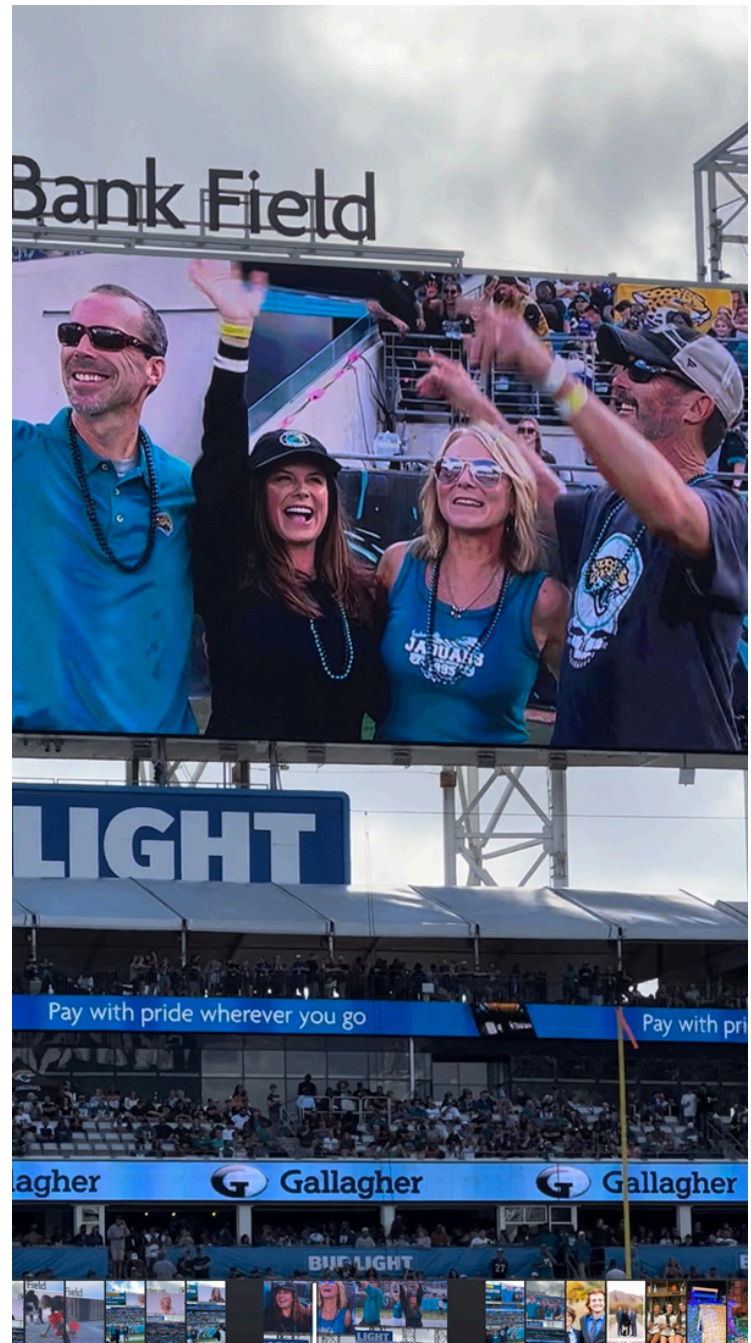
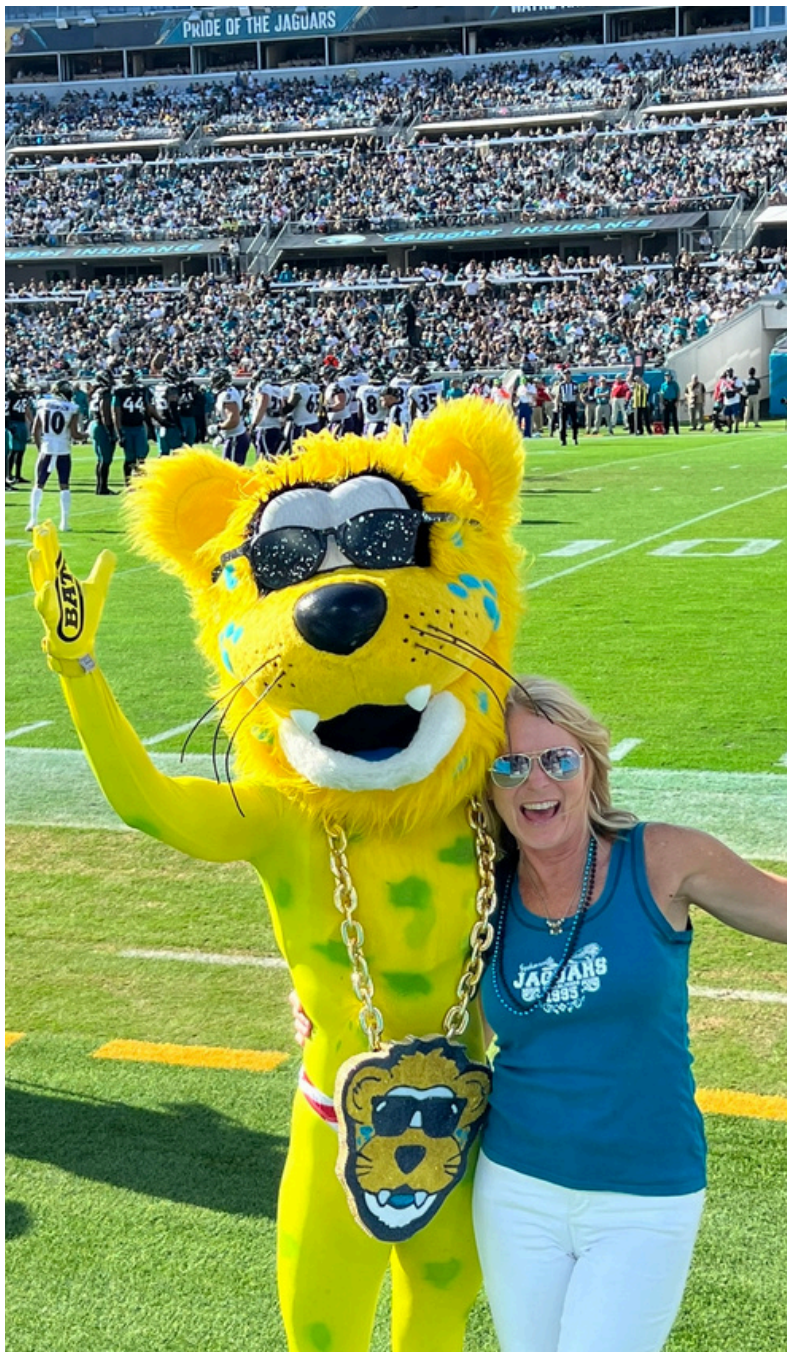

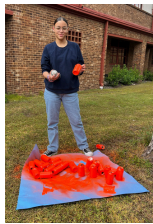
BGG'S OWN KIM DECKER REUSES WINS COMMUNITY CHAMPION AWARD!

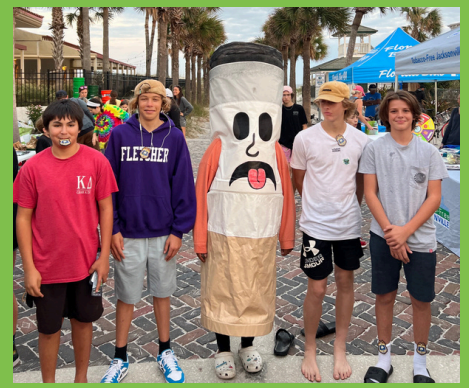
